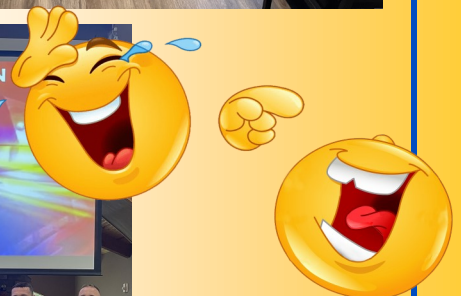

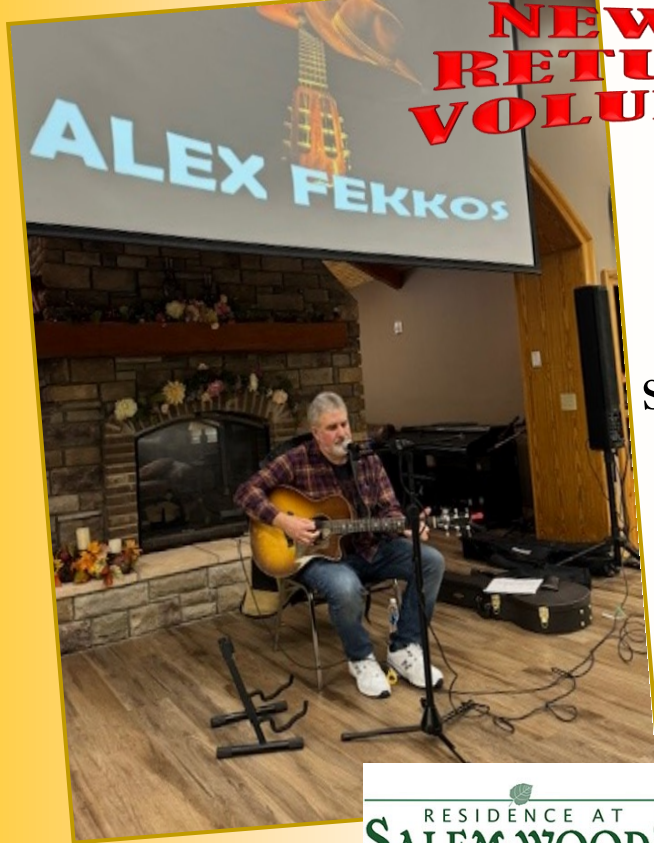

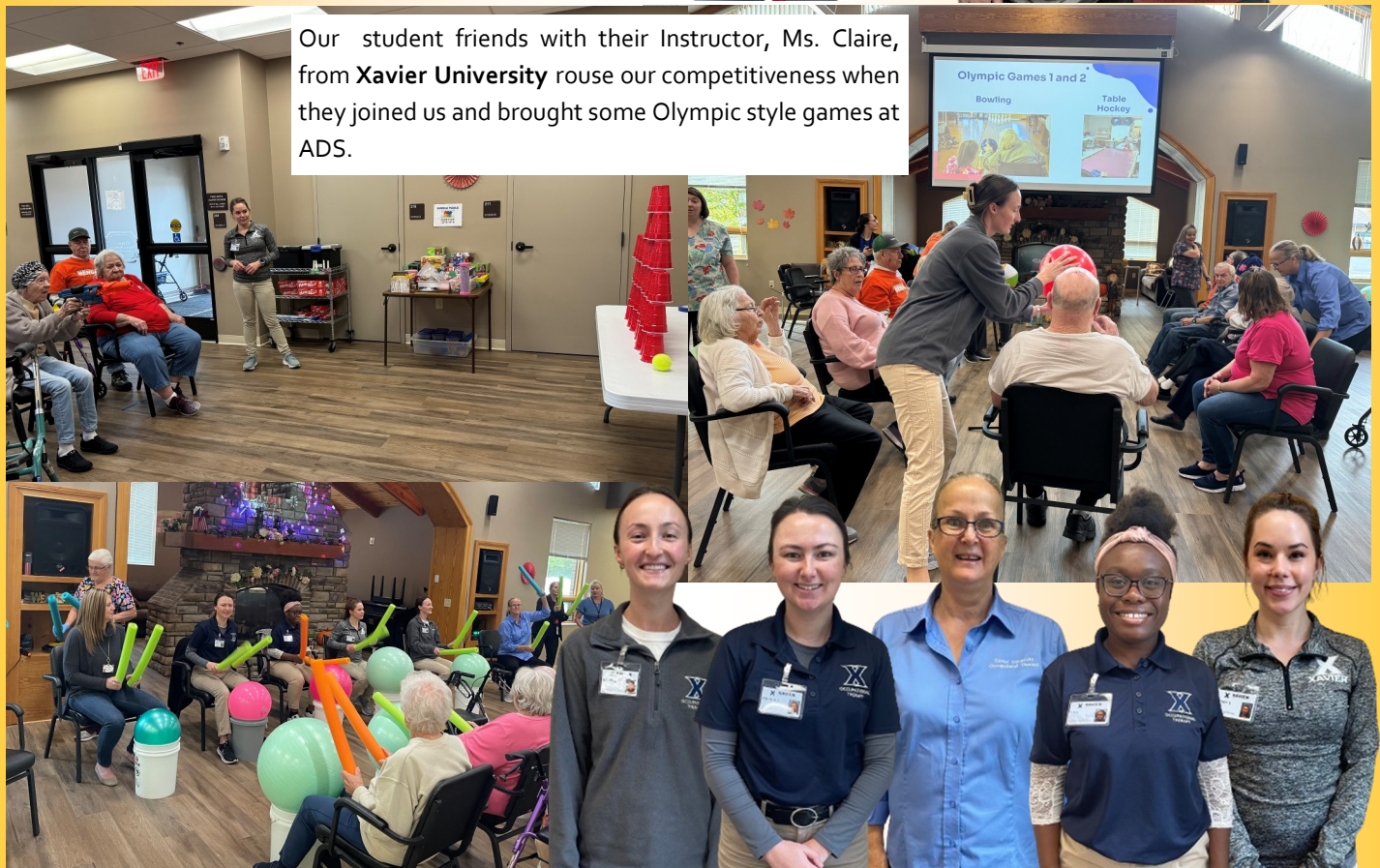

## YOUR FALL RECIPE

### PUMPKIN DUMP CAKE
